Big Bend ARC To Offer Licensing Class

The Big Bend Amateur Radio Club will sponsor a licensing class beginning on March 5, 2018. Upon completion of the class, students will be able to take the Technician Class exam for a Ham Radio License with all the privileges associated with that license class. Cost of the class is \$29.95 which is the cost of the license manual. The exam costs \$15.

ARRL Board Backs Off On Gagging Board Members; Pledges More Transparency

The ARRL Board of Directors took action on a number of items at its Annual Meeting, January 19-20, in Windsor, Connecticut, including adopting a motion to a review the entire code of conduct for Board members, known officially as the ARRL Policy on Board Governance and Conduct of Members of the Board of Directors and Vice Directors. ARRL Officers, Directors, and Vice Directors will review the code of conduct and complete a final draft version 60 days ahead of the Board's July 2018 meeting. In the same motion, the Board deleted and suspended sections that were considered ambiguous and in conflict with the intent of the code of conduct requiring Board members to act in the best interest of the League's membership.

The Board also voted unanimously to amend a policy affecting candidates for ARRL elected offices, including Directors and Vice Directors. The new policy calls for candidates to be informed in writing at the outset of the nomination process that decisions of the Board's Ethics and Elections Committee concerning candidate eligibility will be made public unless the candidate requests otherwise. In addition, if the Ethics and Elections Committee rejects a candidate's petition, the candidate may ask that the reason(s) for rejection not be made public. Unless confidentiality is requested within 10 business days, the reason(s) for rejection may be made public.

A proposed addition to the <u>ARRL Articles of</u>
<u>Association</u> regarding the personal liability and indemnification of Directors will be reviewed by the Executive Committee, the General Counsel, and ARRL Connecticut corporate counsel.

Proposed amendments to the <u>ARRL Bylaws</u> regarding Life Membership were referred to the Administration and Finance Committee for further consideration.

It was decided that if these or any additional changes are proposed, they will be made available to the membership and will be accompanied by explanatory "white papers" before the Board considers action on them.

The Board approved an amendment, effective immediately, to Section II, Rule 1 of ARRL's **DXCC Rules** (Political Entities) that will confer DXCC entity status to an entity that has its own International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) **member society** and is included on the US Department of State's list of **Independent States** in the World. In 2004, the Board had removed a rule that extended DXCC status by virtue of having been admitted as an IARU member society. (**See related story**.)

In other action, the Board approved a motion requiring that minutes of Board meetings be

published only after being formally approved by the Board.

The Board unanimously adopted ARRL's 2018-2019 financial plan. Up to \$30,000 was allocated to fund the discovery and strategy phase of the Lifelong Learning Initiative. The Board will receive a progress report on the project at its July meeting.

Addressing administrative matters, the Board unanimously adopted a motion to form a CEO Search Committee to identify a candidate for Chief Executive Office for Board election. The committee, which is authorized to engage a search consultant, will report periodically to the Board and at the July meeting. Committee members will include Treasurer Rick Niswander, K7GM (chair), Central Division Director Kermit Carlson, W9XA; Roanoke Division Director Jim Boehner, N2ZZ, West Gulf Division Director Dr. David Woolweaver, K5RAV, and First Vice President Greg Widin, K0GW.

3Y0Z Dxpedition Aborts

The Bouvet Island Dxpedition team has had to abort their DXpedition. They arrived at the island via ship and were waiting for the weather to clear so they could begin helicoptering to land on January 31. On February 3, they were still expecting another four days before the weather cleared when the ship captain announced there was a problem with one of the ship's engines.

There intent was to return to Punta Arenas, Chile. On February 5, the captain decided it would be better, and safer, to head for Capetown, South Africa.

The team is safe but very disappointed. They are pledging to try again when they can.

Bouvet is the number two most needed country.

The island has been described as "The Most Isolated Island on Earth." It is located in the South Atlantic just north of the Antarctic.

From Alpine, the beam heading is 138 degrees.

The 20-man team was to be on the island until the end of February. More info can be found at https://www.bouvetdx.org/

Kosova, Z6, Now On The Air As New DXCC Country

From ARRL:

A new on-the-air team is taking the reins at Z60A, as "Project Goodwill Kosovo" moves into its second week, with only 2 weeks to go until the actual 10th anniversary of Kosovo's independence. Hams from 10 countries will take part in the Project's current phase. Z60A has been on the air since January 21, steadily winnowing down demand for Kosovo as a DXCC entity; the republic jumped to the top of Club Log's DXCC Most Wanted List after attaining DXCC status, putting it ahead of North Korea and Bouvet Island.

The Z60A operators are operating split, UP/DN from their transmit frequency. Pay attention to operators' instructions.

A recent reception celebrated Kosovo's new DXCC status, with remarks by IARU member society **SHRAK** President Vjollca Belegu Caka, Z61VB; the Chair of Kosovo's telecommunications regulator (ARKEP) Kreshnik Gashi, ARRL Honorary Vice President Jim Fenstermaker, K9JF; IARU Region 1 Secretary Hans Blondeel Timmerman, PB2T, and Project Goodwill Kosovo Coordinator Martti Laine, OH2BH.

During the celebration, some 40,000 contacts have been logged so far at Z60A, with operators
